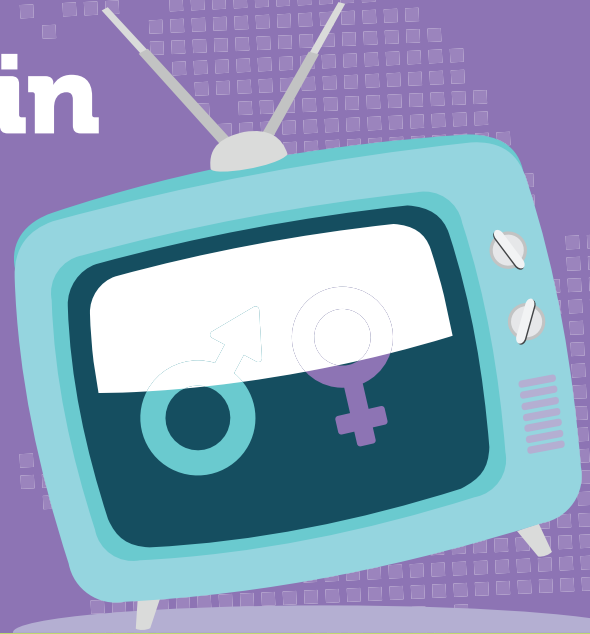


Gender equality in the TV Industry

Men outnumber women on TV two to one

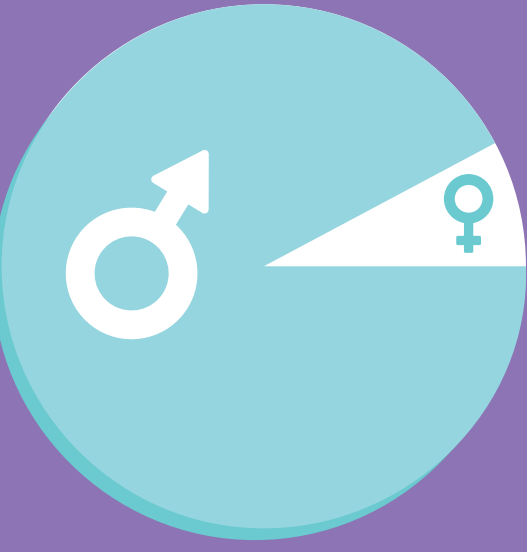


Of the 45 **new shows** in 2017-2018:

2 male international editors earned at least **50%+** more than their female equivalents

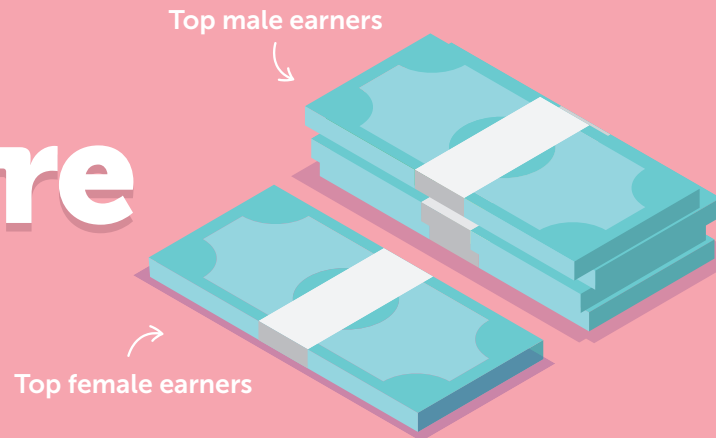
